B: Social media communication campaign (coordinated by FAIS)



As a follow-up of the EU training session, an informal EU working group will be encouraged with the aim to **develop a communication campaign** – through virtual meetings - on the value of access to care, with a specific focus on intimate health conditions and ostomate patients.

STEPS

- select experts & leaders from PAGs already involved in the A activity
- Support of an external communication agency
- Analysis and presentation of the work done in Italy on the issue through the FAIS awareness campaign "Unsaccodaraccontare" and collection of similar experiences from other European countries
- Key messages in EN and national languages
- Promotion on social media: e.g. Facebook, X, Instagram, etc.
- Dissemination through FAIS and ACN communication channels: websites, newsletters
- Dissemination through the communication channels of the involved PAGs









C: Policy Recommendations (coordinated by FAIS)



As a third step of the project, the informal EU working group will be encouraged to draft Policy Recommendations addressed to institutions and relevant stakeholders.

STEPS

- Analysis and presentation of the work done in Italy on the topic by FAIS, e.g. <u>survey</u>, and collection of similar experiences from other European countries
- Literature review
- Stakeholder analysis: identification of different targets to contact (MEPs, European Commission, HCPs, PAGs, etc.)
- Signing of Policy Recommendations by associations involved in Action A and other stakeholders sensitized through Action B







D: Policy dialogue with the EU Institution (coordinated by ACN)
